# Reading for Easter I: John 20, 19- end

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the lews, lesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this. he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. lesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when lesus came. So the other disciples told him. "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side. I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, lesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to

believe that lesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

#### Reflection

Have we personally met the Risen Christ? Would we recognise Him? Has He changed our lives?

This passage today leaves us with no doubt how to live " As the Father has sent me, so I send you." A huge responsibility to live like Jesus, a privilege to take on His work, as Disciples we are sent to do the things lesus did, to follow in His footsteps, living with the mind of Christ. Of course we are not abandoned to figure this out for ourselves, we can walk boldly, telling of what He has done and is doing, we know His ways from the Bible, we know Him from His Spirit within us, we know He walks with us as a friend and as God.

We should not think we are not up to the task, these guys abandoned Him after He was arrested, denied Him, yet here He is sending them out into the world to represent Him, yes to represent the One they now recognised as God, in the words of Thomas, "My Lord and my God",

As God's people we are worthy to do His work, we know we can proclaim God's forgiveness of sin by repenting and believing in Him, we know this leads to life with Him now and always, we know through Him we have 'peace with God' and in the present uncertain
